I am currently the head of the Research Centre for Health Economics and Evaluation at the Faculty of Public Health, Mahidol University in Thailand. My research agenda focuses on evaluation and optimisation of health- and health-system related strategies and interventions in developing countries. I have worked extensively to identify health costs and economic impacts of HIV/AIDS, both at the national level (in Thailand, India, and Cambodia) and at the international level, through UNAIDS and the World Health Organisation (WHO). I would be able to provide academic knowledge of provider purchasing mechanisms (both through the public sector and through private firms) as well as an understanding of current trends in this area, drawing from the experiences of colleagues within the Thai public health system and the WHO. My research expertise includes demand-side incentives and financing of Thailand's public sector HIV/AIDS services, with a specific focus on patient access and utilization of services. I have been working on projects with the Thai Ministry of Public Health and have coordinated numerous regional workshops on issues related to disease burden and health economics in Southeast Asia.

The Research Centre for Health Economics and Evaluation's (ReCHEE) commitment to policy research is emphasised by its status as both an AIDS Strategy and Action Plan (ASAP) training consortium member and as a WHO/SEARO training facilitator for programme managers from collaborating institutions within the National AIDS Programme. ReCHEE has a history of working closely with international organizations to address HIV/AIDS policy issues. Since 2005, for example, ReCHEE has developed estimates of global resource needs for HIV/AIDS care and treatment on behalf of UNAIDS and WHO. In collaboration with the Futures Group, the Centre developed a resource needs model for use by national AIDS programs and participated in workshops training professionals from over 30 countries in its use. In 2007, ReCHEE assisted with the National Institute of Public Health, Mexico (INSP) at the Caribbean workshop, at which the World Bank's new AIDS strategy was developed. Since 2006 the Centre has served as an invited member of the Asia and the Pacific Technical Reference Group (UNAIDS Reference Group on Economics) – Commission on AIDS in Asia.
